

Reach Out is an organisation that facilitates the placement of volunteers, usually University Students, into projects in such countries as South Africa, Cambodia, Mozambique and Peru.

The volunteers are self-funding and the average length of their placement is six weeks. Reach Out expects to place 800 volunteers next year.

Their Vision is changing the World One Village at a Time and they concentrate on three areas: Community Development, Wildlife Conservation and Cultural Immersion.

Tom's father Peter (pictured with wife Kaye), a retired lawyer, works for Tom in Reach Out and also spoke about their activities.



### **Applicants Sought for Group Study Exchange Team**

We were reminded by Judy Croll in her talk on 3 July that our District will be sending a Group Study Exchange (GSE) team to District 2440 in Turkey in April 2013 with the team being in Gallipoli for Anzac Day. GSE is a long-standing activity funded by the Rotary Foundation. The program provides international travel and accommodation for teams to exchange between paired districts in each country for four weeks. The team of five is led by an experienced Rotarian; the purpose being to enjoy the host country's institutions and way of life, to observe their own vocations as practised abroad, to develop personal and professional relationships and to exchange ideas. Applicants must be between 25 and 40 years of age on the day of departure from Sydney. They must have been fully employed for the past two years, have high ethical standards and have demonstrated leadership in their field of business or employment. Rotarians or their relatives are not eligible to apply.

Members knowing of any potential applicants should communicate with them to ascertain their interest and, if appropriate contact our PP **Philip Perkins** to arrange an initial interview with a view to referral to the District committee. Applications with District close on 30 September.

As a matter of historical interest, Mosman has successfully nominated nine team members and one team leader over the years. The last two were former Rotaractors in Kemuel Lam Paksun who went to Devon in 2002 and Peter Quirk who went to Japan in 2003.

#### Zone Meeting at Norths Leagues Club on Wedneday night 25th July, 2012:

The City North Zone of District 9680 held its District Governors Meeting at North Sydney Leagues Club, the first time as a combined meeting.

All clubs were represented, as was the only Rotaract Club in the District which meets in Chatswood. Many of Mosman's members were delighted to attend.

Total Club membership of the Zone stands at around 210, with a very active Rotaract Club adding a further 30, for a group of 240 people.

The achievements are remarkable and it might be a worthwhile exercise to list the best efforts of each club during a year, in a high achievers summary for the Zone.

Each club is different and each club has different strengths but it became very obvious that a great deal of positive community work is generated as a result of the commitment and work by the members.

DG John Dodd gave the greater amount of time over to the Clubs and allowed our Peter lannazzo time for a promotional talk for the Victory Ball at Victoria Barracks and the Business Lunch in August.

John focused his address on the need for co-operation between Clubs, and the need for clubs to think outside the square. A visit by individual members to other clubs in the Zone would surely be worthwhile, as all have some remarkable achievements to their credit. We have three luncheon clubs in our zone: Crows Nest *Monday*, Mosman *Tuesday*, North Sydney *Friday*. One breakfast club, North Sydney Sunrise *Tuesday*, and two evening clubs: Neutral Bay *Monday*, Northbridge *Tuesday*.
